There are three types of the study of the sounds of language. Acoustic Phonetics is the study of the physical properties of sounds. Auditory Phonetics is the study of the way listeners perceive sounds. Articulatory Phonetics is the study of how the vocal tracts produce the sounds. This article will only describe articulatory phonetics.

What is Phonetics? - Introduction to Linguistics ...

Languages use both voice and the lack of it in the production of speech sounds. If the vocal cords vibrate while the given speech sound is articulated, the sound is voiced; if not, it's voiceless. This second stage of sound production— whether voice is produced in the larynx or not — is called the phonation process.

Chapter 2: The Sounds of Language: Phonetics

Phonology is a branch of linguistics that studies how languages or dialects systematically organize their sounds (or signs, in sign languages). The term also refers to the sound system of any particular language variety. At one time, the study of phonology only related to the study of the systems of phonemes in spoken languages.

This “aspirated p” sound has its own special symbol in the IPA: p^h. In spin, the phoneme is pronounced “normally”; this “normal p” sound is represented by p in the IPA. When supporting children in learning the sounds of the English language, remember to choose words that demonstrate all 44 word-sounds or phonemes. English contains 19 vowel sounds —5 short vowels, 6 long vowels, 3 diphthongs, 2 'oo' sounds, and 3 r-controlled vowel sounds—and 25 consonant sounds.
